Smith, Sr. joined in the Memorial Service of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) in conjunction with the Afro-American Police Officer's League (AAPOL) to commemorate the 2019 National Police Week with the Blessing of the Badge. The Theme was: Sacrifice, Honor \& Remember. The service was hosted by Antioch Baptist Church, 500 Clay Street Houston, TX 77002. Pastor John F. Johnson.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation, which designated May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement. Decades later, the event, more commonly known as National Police Week, has grown to a series of events, which attracts thousands
 of survivors and law enforcement officers to our Nation's Capital each year.
